Subject Overview	Operating in both domestic and international markets, resort and hotel managers respond to a range of economic factors. At a micro level, managers require an understanding of the economic influences on consumer demand and an ability to make informed decisions on supply. On a macro level an appreciation of the economic importance and impact of the resort and hotel industry is required, together with an understanding of the broad environmental influences on activity in this sector. While many economic variables are beyond the control of individual organisations, an understanding of underlying economic principles and their impact is vital in a global environment.
	 The subject content will focus on: demand for and supply of resort and hotel services the external economic environment the impact of government policies on resort and hotel activity international trade and exchange rates sustainability
