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Subject Overview

A thorough understanding of the role of policy and governance is an essential foundation for practitioners working in the food systems and gastronomy sphere. This subject enables students to master the complex and overlapping spaces of food policy and governance. Students will explore public and private food quality and safety standards, guidelines and codes of practice. These range from regional and global standards such as Product Designation of Origin (PDO) and Codex Alimentarius to food safety, labeling and certification regimes administered by national safety regulators. The corporate, labour, public health and environmental protections incorporated in bilateral and multilateral free trade agreements will also be addressed. Drawing on the literature regarding global governance, global political economy and audit culture, students will examine the discursive and structural dimensions of different policy and governance approaches and critically engage with the implications at various levels of the food system.

Learning Outcomes

Evaluate the points of intersection, convergence and contradiction across health, food and agricultural policies at the national and global levels

Articulate the different meanings and functions of the term 'governance' for different stakeholders in the food system, with particular emphasis on the growing role of private sector governance exercised by major corporations

Compare and contrast differing national approaches to food policy and governance and the implications at the local level

Critically analyse discourses of quality, neoliberalism and accountability in governance processes
